Project Information Page



Sewing with Fleece is great for both new and experienced sewers. Members will learn about fleece fabric selection, pattern selection, how to mark, cut and sew fleece fabric, and how to create fun fleece items.

Sewing with Fleece I involves making a hat and mittens, a small pillow and 3 seam samples. Members who are new to sewing are encouraged to complete **Sewing with Fleece I** prior to **Sewing with Fleece II**. However, the sewing leader may use discretion with the member's project selection based on his/her level of experience and comfort working with fleece material and larger pattern pieces

Project Completion Requirements (PCR)

SEWING with FLEECE I

- Three (3) seam samples
- Small fleece pillow
- One pair of mittens and one hat (*pattern is available with the Leader Resource material*)
- Project (1) Page specific to Home Ec or Life Skill Projects

SEWING with FLEECE II

- Three (3) seam samples
- Stuffed animal pillow (*Size - minimum of 50cm or 20" in length*) - *patterns available at the 4-H Office*
- Project (1) Page specific to Home Ec or Life Skill Projects

4-H Year Completion

The following must be on display at the Club Achievement Day in order to complete the 4-H year

- Complete the PCR's (Project Completion Requirements) as outlined above
- Complete a **Communication** (public speaking) Project
- Complete a **Community Service** Activity
- Complete an **Agriculture Awareness** Activity
- Complete the **Member Documentation** (4) pages found in your Portfolio or on the website
