Sewing with Fleece is great for both new and experienced sewers. Members will learn about fleece fabric selection, pattern selection, how to mark, cut and sew fleece fabric, and how to create fun fleece items.

Sewing with Fleece I involves making a hat and mittens, a small pillow and 3 seam samples. Members who are new to sewing are encouraged to complete Sewing with Fleece I prior to Sewing with Fleece II. However, the sewing leader may use discretion with the member's project selection based on his/her level of experience and comfort working with fleece material and larger pattern pieces.
